 - Add a course before the end of the eighth day from the beginning of each semester:
September 13, 2022 and **February 8, 2023**.
 - Drop a course by the end of the day Friday of the week midterm reports are sent home (November and April) without withdraw (WD) being shown on transcript: **November 25, 2022** and **April 14, 2023**.
 - Drop a course from the Monday following midterm report week, to the end of the day on the last Friday of the 4th month of the semester. A withdraw (WD) will be shown on the transcript:
December 16, 2022 and **May 26, 2023**.
